



- 1. Print pages 1- 5 on self-adhesive paper. Cut out the boxes and stick them onto the appropriate pages.
- 2. Print two sets of the flashcards on card stock.
- 3. I recommend using this book after your child can read the adapted version of *Go*, *go*, *go*. (Free at mercyformarthas.com)
- 4. Have your child match, select, then name the sight words. Teach them in sets of three-five. Then do a fast flash with those three to five cards, three times in a row. Once your child can successfully read the sight words, he/she is ready to begin reading the adapted version of *Go, Go, Trucks!*
- 5. When reading the book with your child, the *parent should read any text in grey*. This will help prepare your child for some of the new words he/she is learning and will help with errorless learning. Eventually he/she will be able to read the text in grey.
